Naser Navard Gol-Tapeh, Iran*

Naser Navard Gol-Tapeh* was arrested on 24 June 2016 at an engagement party. Held in solitary confinement for two months and subjected to intense interrogation, he was charged with 'illegal gathering, collusion and evangelism'. At his trial in 2017 Naser was charged with 'acting against national security through the formation and establishment of an illegal church organisation in his home' and was sentenced to ten years in prison. In November he lost his appeal in spite of his lawyer providing numerous grounds for his innocence. In January 2018 he was moved to Evin Prison. He developed a severe gum infection for which he was denied treatment but in January 2019 was reported to be in good spirits and enjoying the company of other Christians.
