Keeping you informed

From the Joint Parish Finance Committee

Last financial year 2021-2022 our parishes operated at a small deficit. This year for 22-23 we have managed a surplus of £27,964. Some of this will be due to receiving funds from the 'Closer to Christ' campaign of £11,285, but really it is all due to your generous giving.

Our goal last year was to increase our giving to cover our basic costs, and then to build reserves of cir £50,000 (approximately 50% of our annual running costs). This reserve was required so that we could meet any expenses resulting from the Diocesan quinquennial report completed in 2021. We continue to maintain these reserves even after major projects such as the renewing of the patio and stairs in Fordingbridge.

The 22-23 financial year saw a sharp rise in our regular running costs because of inflation and rising energy costs. We tried to mitigate these increases by looking very closely at all our expenditure across the two parishes to gain cost savings and increased efficiency. We also ensured that every project undertaken was done for the best value for money.

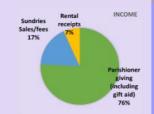
Thank you for your continued generosity and we look forward to continuing to work with you to keep our parishes in a good financial position for 2023-2024.

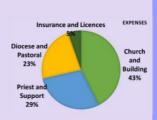
